MANAGER Q&A

with Haydon Price

• After two seasons as an assistant coach, you took over as Manager in 2024, what differences did you see/lessons did you learn in your new role?

I think the biggest difference from transitioning as an Assistant Coach to the Manager would be the overall responsibility of having the decision making authority. As an Assistant Coach, I would provide my input for specific scenarios when asked upon. Now, as Manager I rely on my assistants to provide me with their input which heavily influences the decisions I make for the team. As Manager, I handle the in game strategies, lineup construction and pitching changes, which are all areas that I've grown within the past year. As an Assistant, I was usually helping prepare the team to win the game in other areas, like getting them warmed up and coaching bases.

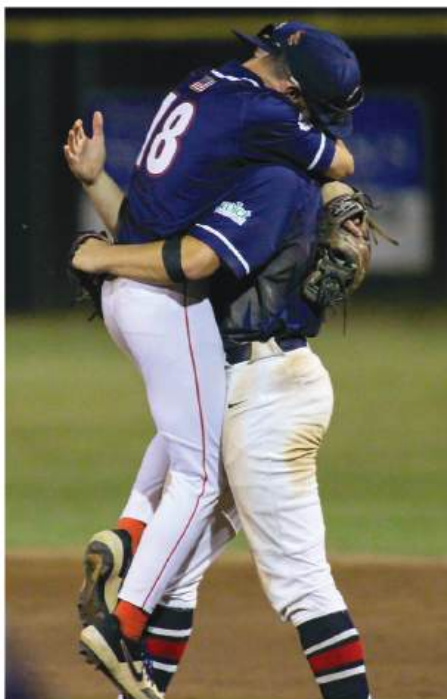
The biggest lesson I learned during my first season as Manager is patience. While we won a lot of games last season, there were also periods where we struggled and weren't playing our best ball. As someone who strives for perfection and a strong desire to win, I quickly realized that achieving sustained success is a process that requires time. Overall, I believe the transition was relatively smooth due to the experience gained during my two years as an assistant coach.

• In your first season, you managed to set a (modern-era) team record for wins in a season, capture a NEWBL Championship, and lead the Blue Ribbons to a State Championship game, where you fell just short to Kenosha. What are your overall thoughts on how your first season went?

Overall, I am extremely pleased with how our first season transpired, given the talent of our roster and the dedication of our coaching staff. We achieved a remarkable level of success, far exceeding what the program has seen in a considerable time. I believe this success is a direct reflection of the diligent work invested by everyone involved, from the board members to the coaching staff and the players. I feel that everyone excelled in their respective roles last year and deserves the recognition we have received across the leagues.

Naturally, falling just short in a heartbreaking State Championship game remains a poignant memory. That being said, there was so much to celebrate. We secured the NEWBL Championship for the first time in history and were the Wisconsin State League Runner-Up. Furthermore, we set numerous organizational records, including wins (34), hits (386), runs scored (301), walks (233), hit by pitch (78), and strikeouts from our pitching staff (408).

I am most proud of how the team handled themselves last season. From our very first team meeting, we established a clear standard: to return to the playoffs and make a significant impact. The group we had truly embraced this challenge, played with a ton of heart throughout the summer, and ultimately propelled us further into the playoffs than any of us could have imagined. I believe the 2024 Blue Ribbons squad should undoubtedly be recognized as one of the finest teams in our program's history.





• Now moving into your second year at the helm, are you feeling more comfortable in your position? What can we expect to see from the Blue Ribbons in 2025?

Yes, I am definitely more comfortable entering my second year as Manager. I feel quite confident in both my own abilities and those of our coaching staff, now that we have a full year of experience under our belts.

Fans can anticipate a newly reloaded Blue Ribbons Baseball team. While we did lose a significant portion of our roster from last season, we are incredibly enthusiastic about the group of players joining us. In many cases, a team with this many new faces might be heading towards a rebuilding phase. However, in our situation, I fully expect our team to compete at the same high level we demonstrated last year. We are young, fast, possess greater depth, and will be a more disciplined team this summer.

• One of the challenges of having success is that other teams start gunning for you and you start being the hunted rather than the hunter. What are your thoughts on going from being the underdog to the top dog and having teams coming at you with their best every night?

It's definitely cool to see the progress we've made over the years with our program heading into the right direction. To me, we have earned the right to face every opponent's best pitcher and lineup night in and night out. A direct result of winning frequently is that everyone wants a piece of us. This is what I thrive on and what I love to do. The opportunity to compete against the best, going pitch for pitch and base for base with the top competition on a nightly basis, there is nothing better.

Facing each team's best pitcher also provides our team with consistent exposure to high-quality pitching throughout the regular season. This means that by the time we reach the playoffs, there's a strong possibility we will have already faced the caliber of pitching we might encounter. As our Manager, it is my duty to ensure all our players adopt the mindset that to be the best, we must beat the best. I am fortunate to have a clubhouse full of 40 players who are hungry for a championship.

• Successful teams also wind up with a lot of turnover, due to players earning promotions to play at higher levels. With many players from last year's team moving on to play in the Cape Cod, Futures, and Northwoods Leagues, how do you tackle the challenge of having to re-load and build almost a brand new roster without the benefit of a veteran squad?

It's definitely not easy when we lost a majority of our Starting Pitching Staff, who were experienced veterans for us. However, a hallmark of a successful program is the influx of talent that comes through. When we consistently win and compete for league championships, it significantly benefits us in recruiting, as high level players naturally want to be part of a winning organization.

After losing some really big pieces from last year, there was certainly initial concern about how we would adapt our recruiting efforts. I would say, for the most part, the recruiting

process took care of itself. Over the past couple of seasons, we have had numerous high-level players from the area reach out because they aspire to be part of our organization. I believe our past success has directly contributed to our ability to effectively reload our roster this offseason.

• You're one of the most competitive guys around, and are intent on building a winning program, but at the same time, show a great deal of concern for your players and their development. While other teams might have pitchers throwing 170 pitches a game, you are very careful about managing workloads and making sure you are doing things the right way and putting the best interests of your players first. How difficult is that, trying to balance winning with development and doing what is best for your players?

Everyone has their own style of coaching and I've had the opportunity to play for some really good ones. While they were all distinct in their approaches, they shared one common trait: a strong desire to win.

My approach to coaching may differ from past generations of baseball coaches and players. I would describe myself as more of a "players' coach." I strongly value the input and feedback from our players, and their perspectives heavily influence my decisions. I have learned that simply caring about your players, their individual goals, their ambitions, and inquiring about their lives outside of baseball goes a long way. I connect with my players in various ways, but my primary aim is for them to understand that I care and am here to guide them. Ultimately, we want what is best for our players, and we recognize that by helping them achieve their personal and athletic goals, they tend to place greater trust in us.

• Looking ahead to this year's squad, you've got a lot of new faces. Especially on the pitching side of things, where you've lost some big arms like Kaden Krueger, Reece Piontek, Allen Leitner, Austin Grube and more. Out of 352.1 innings thrown last season, only 76.2 of those innings were from players returning in 2025, with the bulk of those coming from two players, Owen Deprez and Benje Hencke, how does that affect your plans for the upcoming season? Assuming you'll rely heavily on those two vets, which new faces are you hoping to see step up and establish themselves on the pitching staff?

Entering this season, we recognized that we had our work cut out for us in terms of solidifying our pitching staff. We lost key leadership and experience, and our aim is to reload with individuals who have a history of winning and pitching in high-stakes situations. While we will certainly rely on Owen Deprez and Benje Hencke, we are very excited to see several rookies slot into our rotation and compete for innings.

Some new faces I am particularly hoping to see step up and establish themselves on the pitching staff include RHP Axel Donaldson, LHP Joe Anderson, RHP JT Hockers, RHP Cameron St. John, RHP Easton Arendt, and LHP Landon Raygo.





• The lineup is a little more stable, with players like James Bornick, Jake Petasek, Eason Hurd, Landen Lozier and Payton Kohnle all returning, but you also lost some thump with the departures of Brady LaViolette and Brendan Willadsen. Tell us about a few of the rookie position players that fans can expect to see step in and make an impact at Joannes Stadium this summer?

We are definitely going to miss having Willy and Brady's bats in our lineup this summer, however I am thrilled with the guys who we have brought into this year's group.

UTIL George McIntyre - George will be going into his sophomore year at North Iowa Area CC, this season, George hit 15 home runs and stole 16 bases. We expect George to fit in just fine.

OF/INF Brayden Pleau - Brayden just completed his sophomore year at Bryant & Stratton. He batted .353 with 3 home runs and 17 extra-base hits. He will be another cornerstone of our lineup this summer.

OF Trevor Vande Hey - Trevor is currently a senior at Wrightstown High School. This University of Iowa commit could arguably be the most athletic player on the field. A combination of power, speed, and strength will be on full display this summer.

OF/P Easton Arendt - Easton just finished his freshman year at Winona State. He is a two-way player, a right-handed pitcher and outfielder. Easton hit .395 on a senior-heavy Winona squad.

• **Coming up a game short last season was a little bittersweet. We saw the potential that this young team had, and the future looks very bright, but at the same time, winners don't get excited about waving a second place trophy around. What are your goals and expectations for the 2025 season, and do you think when all is said and done, this team has the horses to finish the job and bring home a title?**

Our goal as a team is to win both league championships. Last year, we really just wanted to get into the playoffs. About mid way through last season, we knew that we had a real shot of being the top dog in both leagues. This season, the expectation from day one is to win a championship. While we cannot win a championship on Day 1, we can certainly begin doing the things it takes to achieve one. I believe that over the course of the summer, as our team develops chemistry, we can become a very dangerous force. When all is said and done, I believe this team is more well-rounded than last year's squad; it will ultimately be up to our pitching staff to help us get over the hump and bring home a league championship.

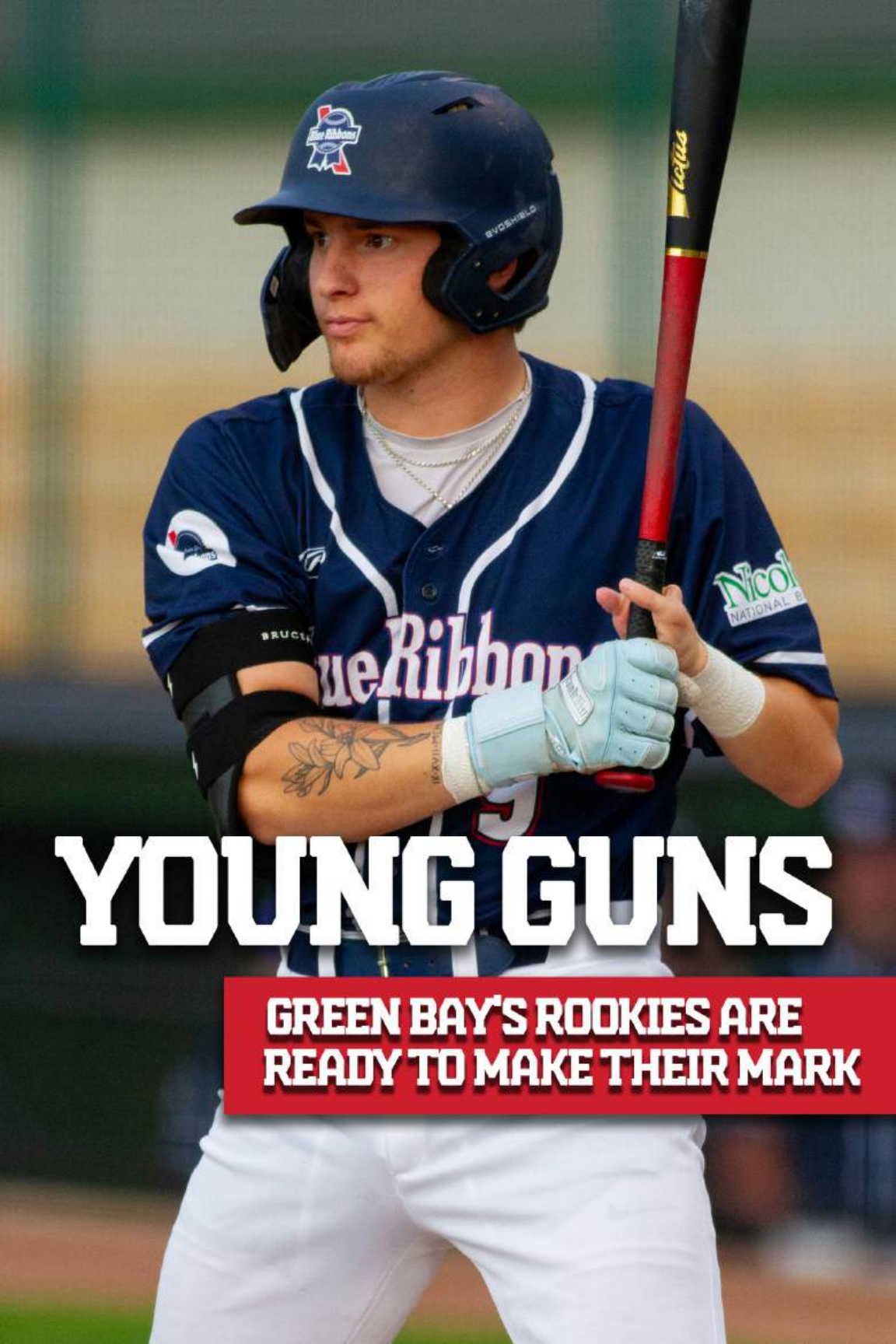

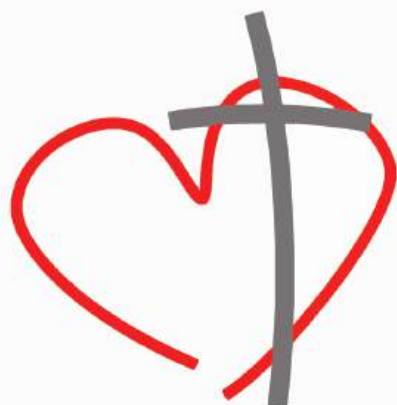

The 2025 Blue Ribbons team might be one of the youngest in team history, but they also have the potential to be the most talented. In total, 27 players are scheduled to make their debut with the club. You might need a roster early in the season to tell players apart, but many of these players should be household names in Green Bay by the end of the year, so let us introduce you to some of the newest faces you'll be seeing around Joannes Stadium this summer.

STARS READY TO SHINE

Several of the 2025 rookies are being counted on to make their mark early and often this season, including Iowa commit Trevor Vande Hey, Minnesota native George McIntyre, Kimberly alum Brayden Pleau, and Madison backstop Ian Salvesen.

Vande Hey, a recent graduate of Wrightstown High School, where he recorded over 100 hits during his high school career, is ranked as one of the top position players in the state among the class of 2025. His combination of speed and power should serve the Blue Ribbons well in center field once he joins the team at the conclusion of the Tigers' playoff run.

McIntyre, who can play both infield and outfield, joins the Blue Ribbons from Edina, Minnesota. He is coming off of a monster freshman season at North Iowa Area CC, where he saw action in 52 games, blasting 15 home runs, while slashing .320/.406/.649 with an OPS of 1.055.

Pleau, another versatile player who could see time in the outfield or at third base, might be a name that is familiar to Blue Ribbons fans, as he has played previously in the Wisconsin State League with the West Allis Nationals. He recently wrapped up his sophomore season at Bryant & Stratton, where he became the program's all-time hit leader, and hit .353 with 11 doubles, 3 triple and 3 home runs this past spring.

Salvesen, a catcher/infielder at Madison JC is a graduate of Wittenberg-Biramwood High School, where he shattered the school's all-time hits record. He was named first-team All-Conference as a senior in 2024, and was selected to participate in the WBCA All-Star Classic in Oshkosh last June.

AN ARMS RACE

One baseball fact that will always be true, it that you can never have enough pitching. The Blue Ribbons have added a ton of new arms this season, including a trio that could make a big impact.

Joe Anderson, a left-handed hurler from Maranatha Baptist University, comes to Green Bay after being named the Shoreland League's Most Valuable Player and Pitching Champion as a two-way player with the Kewaunee Chiefs. In the Shoreland last season, he went 4-1 with a 1.02 ERA while striking out 120 batters over 53 innings of work.

Ethan Oatman, a right-hander from Mosinee, was ranked as one of the top arms in the state before being sidelined by injury. The North Iowa Area CC commit is healthy once again, and the Ribbons will be looking forward to watching him shove this summer.

A third player who could work his way into the pitching mix is righty Kegan Schlichting, who will be joining Green Bay for the second half of the season. An Oshkosh North High School graduate from Omro, Schlichting should provide a boost to the Blue Ribbons pitching staff for the stretch run.

THE CHAMPS ARE HERE

This year's Ribbons squad has a strong De Pere presence as well, including four players who were a part of the Redbirds 2024 State Championship team. Easton Arendt, Axel Donaldson, Milo Upton and Landon Raygo all got to celebrate at Fox Cities Stadium last summer after bringing home a title for De Pere, and they'll get to continue to play together this summer, when all four rookies make their Blue Ribbons debut.

WE WANT BAMA

While most players have local ties to the Green Bay area, some of them still travel a great distance to play the game they love, including infielder/pitcher Zachary Grossman, who makes his way back to Green Bay this summer after having wrapped up his senior year of high school at Evangel Christian School in Alabaster, Alabama. Grossman went 9-0 with a 1.65 ERA and struck out 82 batters over 50.2 innings on the mound, while also hitting .500 with an OPS of 1.416 to help lead the Lightning to a State Championship.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

One player who is quite familiar with the friendly confines of Joannes Stadium is outfielder Nate Wertel, who played his high school baseball at The Jo, as a member of the Preble Hornets. After wrapping up his freshman season at College of Lake County in Illinois, Wertel will get the chance to return home to take the field with the Ribbons.

PIRATE PRIDE

A perennial high school powerhouse, Bay Port has sent their fair share of players on to play for the Blue Ribbons in recent years, and 2025 will be no different. Four former Bay Port Pirates will be making their debut this summer, with pitchers Dylan Heier and Ky Mueller, outfielder Caleb Schierl, and two-way player Sawyer Larson all ready to follow in the footsteps of stars like James Bornick, Eli Frank and Matt Perry.

WESTSIDE CONNECTION

The youngest player in Blue Ribbons history when he donned the uniform at just 16 years of age in 2023, Riker Blahnik is back for his third season with the club, and he's bringing a pair of fellow Appleton West grads with him this time. Cameron St. John, a D1 commit, will be a key part of Green Bay's pitching staff in the first half of the season before heading off to Campbell University, and catcher Dimitry Edmunds, ticketed for Colorado-Mesa will have a chance to compete for time behind the plate, as well as in the outfield.

PREP PLUS

St. John and Edmunds aren't the only recent high school stars set to join the Ribbons this year either, with pitchers Ian Aoki (Ashwaubenon/UW-Stevens Point), Henry Klatt (Green Bay Southwest/Wabash Valley), Evan Cichanofsky (Bay Port/UW-Superior), Connor Papilham (Denmark/Rock Valley JC) and Brett Paulsen (Kewaunee) all being added to the pitching staff.

Infielder Drew Siudzinski, a Notre Dame Triton who will be attending UW-Lacrosse brings his power bat to the lineup, and outfielder Levi Watts, a Rock Valley commit, will look to make his mark with his excellent defense and plus speed on the bases when he joins the squad once Appleton North's season wraps up.

MOVIN' ON UP

FROM THE CAPE COD LEAGUE, TO THE NORTHWOODS LEAGUE, AND EVEN INTO THE PROS, THE GREEN BAY BLUE RIBBONS ARE ESTABLISHING THEMSELVES AS A SPRINGBOARD TO SUCCESS FOR MANY PLAYERS.



When the Blue Ribbons saw their 2024 season end just a game short of a State Championship, with a loss to Kenosha, one of the popular rallying cries heard around Green Bay, was "Run it Back".

While that sounds like a great plan, in theory, it's a little harder to pull off in reality, as the Blue Ribbons have become a victim of their own success, seeing many of their players for last year's squad, advance to play at higher levels this summer.

No roster is ever going to look the same from year-to-year, but the 2025 Blue Ribbons were hit especially hard by promotions.

Pitcher Ethan Plog, an MLB draft prospect who is committed to pitch for the LSU Tigers next season, will become just the second player in team history to

to appear in the prestigious Cape Cod League when he heads to the east coast in June to pitch against some of the top collegiate talent in the country.

Catcher Brady Lavolette, a key cog in the Ribbons lineup last season, was selected to participate in the Futures League following his freshman season at the University of Ohio, signing with the Westfield Starfires, while 2024 MVP Brendan Willadsen is making his way to the Great Lakes Summer Collegiate League, where he'll be playing for the Southern Ohio Copperheads.

And then, of course, there are the inevitable promotions to the Northwoods League, with infielder Bryson Webb playing for the Minot Hot Tots and right-hander Grant Schroeder pitching for the Eau Claire Express.

"I think it's a really good problem to have" said Manager Haydon Price prior to the team's annual Red/Blue scrimmage. It kind of speaks to the talent that we're bringing in to this organization. Now we're starting to get more high-level guys. I think our success last year really helped on the recruiting side of things."

Assistant coach Brian Price, Jr. agreed, saying "I think it's huge that these guys can look up to some bigger Blue Ribbons role models and hopefully transfer into a bigger summer team in the future."

Over the course of their history the Ribbons have had dozens of players go on to play professionally, including more than 40 who went into affiliated ball with Major League Baseball organizations.

And with the explosion in Independent Leagues in recent years, even more former Blue Ribbons are getting a shot to play professionally, including two alumni who signed pro contracts just this year.

Right-handed pitcher Jett Thielke, who pitched for Green Bay in 2020, signed with the Gateway Grizzlies of the Frontier League before being sidelined by injury, and first baseman

Sam Ott, who played for the Ribbons in 2022, inked a deal with the Dublin Leprechauns of the Pecos League, where he has already established himself as a key bat in the heart of the Leprechauns order.

In recent years however, the league that has far-and-away benefited the most from the Blue Ribbons success, has been the nearby Northwoods League.

Once ranking right behind the Cape Cod League among college players looking to play summer ball, the Northwoods is now among a handful of options, presenting even more opportunities for local players to play summer ball at a higher level.

When Major League Baseball contracted 42 minor league teams in 2021, it resulted in more and more college summer leagues popping up, and with many players taking advantage of the chance to play closer to home, the trickle-down resulted in more roster spots available in the Northwoods League.

Following the MLB Draft in July, and moving into the last few weeks of the season, as many colleges ask their players to shut down, Northwoods teams inevitably come calling on the Blue Ribbons, raiding the roster for players.

In 2023, the Blue Ribbons saw a record seven players signed to play in the Northwoods, and last year the team lost five players - Landen Lozier (Willmar Stingers), JT Hockers (Fond du Lac Dock Spiders), Benje Hencke (Green Bay Rockers), Eli Frank (Wuasau Woodchucks) and Ashton Long (Thunder Bay Border Cats).

It's likely to be more of the same in 2025, after the Blue Ribbons claimed their first NEWBL title in franchise history, and advanced to the Wisconsin State Championship game last season. After all, what team wouldn't want to pull players from a winning program? But as Coach Price said, it's a good problem to have, and with the depth that Green Bay has built, there are plenty more players waiting in the wings, looking to take full advantage when they get their shot to climb the prospect ladder.
